New or changed conditions

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You may receive notification of a newly reported condition for which liability has not been determined under the SRC Act. A newly reported condition is a condition that has not previously been claimed by an employee and may or may not be related to an existing compensation claim.

If you receive notification of a newly reported condition, you are required to assess the condition.

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Changed diagnosis

For compensation to be payable, you must find if liability for a claim relating to an 'injury' exists under section 14(1) of the SRC Act.

Once liability for a claimed condition has been accepted, the compensable condition can evolve, change, or vary over the life of the claim. The circumstances in which a change in diagnosis is required may be made at different stages in the life of the claim.

You may receive a notification where the diagnosis provided has changed from the condition for which liability was originally determined by Comcare. When this occurs, you are responsible for assessing the newly reported condition and establishing whether the new condition is the same, or different, from the compensable condition.

Newly reported conditions

You may receive notification of a newly reported condition for which liability has not been determined under the SRC Act. A newly reported condition is a condition that has not previously been claimed by an employee and may, or may, not be related to an existing compensation claim.

If you receive a notification of a newly reported condition, you are required to assess the condition, including the circumstances in which the condition occurred and decide whether the condition should be treated as a:

- new claim
- continuation of an employee's compensable condition against the existing claim, or
- neither.

This section will discuss changed diagnoses and newly reported conditions.
